ENHANCED UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS ARE ENDING SOON

If you are receiving unemployment benefits through Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC) or Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA), and are receiving an additional \$300 a week on top of your regular unemployment benefits, the last week those additional benefits will be available is the week ending **September 4, 2021**. To verify which unemployment benefits you are receiving, you can look in your unemployment insurance account. You will also be receiving official notification in the mail from the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development's (DEED's) Unemployment Insurance office.

As we know, this will be a time of transition for many Minnesotans, and we are hosting three webinars this month to explain how CareerForce can help you find a job or new career path – at no cost to you.

CareerForce is Minnesota's workforce system and DEED plays a key role in this essential work of connecting residents with family-sustaining jobs and employers with the workers they need for their businesses to grow and thrive. MINNESOTA STATE FAIR WON'T MANDATE FACE MASKS

While strongly urging masking in a new announcement, the State Fair still won't require them everywhere. "Mandating masks fairgrounds-wide would be extremely difficult for our organization to enforce, so we are urging you to pitch in and do what's right."

The Minnesota State Fair released updated guidance on its COVID-19 policy last Wednesday, saying that while it strongly urges masking, it will not be required. The fair also won't require vaccination proof or a recent negative COVID-19 test for entry, or set attendance limits.

"The Minnesota State Fair needs every fair fan to do their part and most of all, do the right thing," [the announcement states](#). "The current health situation is not an ideal backdrop for the Great Minnesota Get-Together tradition. We understand that by urging rather than requiring people to follow current guidance, many of our usual fair fans will not be comfortable attending. We ask that those who attend do so because they are willing to follow our health guidance—not because it's mandated, but because it's the right thing to do."

The Minnesota Department of Health is advising people who are not yet fully vaccinated for COVID-19, immunocompromised, or caregivers to reduce their risk by avoiding large gatherings and wearing a face mask wherever social distancing is not possible. MDH also recommends that people who attend large events [get tested](#) for COVID-19 three to five days afterward.

"We are largely an outdoor event with plenty of eating and drinking," the statement continues. "Mandating masks fairgrounds-wide would be extremely difficult for our organization to enforce, so we are urging you to pitch in and do what's right. Particularly if you go inside, simply put a face covering on for the time you're shopping or visiting an exhibit." The fair says it added space in some high-traffic areas with "hundreds of benches and tables" to encourage people to social distance.

Masks will be required, regardless of vaccine status, at the Care & Assistance and First Aid buildings, and the North End Event Center to donate blood or get a vaccine. MDH, Ramsey County, and Homeland Health will offer [free vaccines](#) during the fair, without requiring identification or insurance. Masks will be available at the entrance gates, information booths, and certain building entrances. It will also be necessary to mask up in order to ride a trolley for those not vaccinated.

The State Fair suggests people attend on weekdays rather than the typically more crowded weekends to lower risk. The fair will also release a "Gopher Gauge" on its website in the coming days to track daily attendance. A "variety of local, state and federal agencies," including the Ramsey County Sheriff's Office, will provide security. New this year, the fair will also have walk-through metal detectors at all entry gates.

The Centers for Disease Control currently lists [nearly every county](#) in Minnesota as at high or substantial risk for community transmission of COVID-19, and recommends masking for all people, regardless of vaccination status, in those areas.

The fair and its vendors are also struggling to [find enough workers](#), just a day before opening day on Aug. 26.

MASKING & DISTANCING - HAS THE SCIENCE CHANGED?

No, the situation itself has. Masking recommendations change based on transmission rates. We've seen increased transmission and we've seen new variants come along. It's a lot like a weather watch on the TV. As the situation changes, the meteorologists upgrade you from a watch to a warning. This is no different. Evidence has shown that those who are vaccinated still have the potential to transmit COVID-19, even if they don't have symptoms, because of that the CDC is recommending that everyone wear masks even if they're vaccinated to help slow this delta variant surge and give a chance to those who aren't vaccinated to get vaccinated and avoid getting hospitalized or seriously ill.

What about kids? Over 500 kids have died of COVID-19 in our country, and we know there can be long-lasting effects from this infection that we're still trying to understand. We don't know the impacts of this illness on their developing organs and bodies. Because of the concerns that have been raised about negative effects of masking on children, there have been numerous studies – all showing there are no negative health effects. COVID-19 VACCINATION - UNVACCINATED POPULATIONS REMAIN THE HIGHEST RISK GROUP

Get vaccinated. The number of COVID-19 infections, mostly with the delta variant, continues to rise, especially in parts of the U.S. where vaccination rates are low. Younger people are among those being infected with the highly contagious virus. The most important thing we can do to [protect kids under 12 years of age](#), who are not yet eligible to be vaccinated themselves, is to ensure that as many people who are around them and who are interacting with them are vaccinated.

With back-to-school season here, we all want our students to be where they learn best – in the classroom with teachers and friends. We can all do our part to get students back to school safely by getting vaccinated. Vaccines are extremely effective protecting against death, hospitalization and severe disease. Not only does it protect you, but it may also prevent you from spreading the COVID-19 virus to others. Help us achieve [herd immunity](#) to protect those who are unable to receive the vaccine due to age or medical conditions.

Immunocompromised? Third shot now available. Patients who [are immunocompromised](#) are eligible to receive a [third dose of COVID-19 vaccine](#). These patients have been identified and will be contacted through Patient Online Services or by mail to schedule an appointment. If you are not a Mayo Clinic Health System patient and believe you are eligible for an additional dose, you should seek an appointment at a local health care provider or pharmacy.
